



Handbell Refurbishment Needed



Mount Olive's handbells were generously donated in 2000 by Mr. William Selle, in honor of his wife, Ruth A. Selle. They

have been used regularly since then to glorify God and enhance worship services.

After so many years of faithful service, they are in serious need of professional refurbishment. During refurbishing each bell will disassembled. inspected, polished, and parts repaired or replaced as needed. They will also be individually re-tuned to make sure each bell's sound is of the highest quality, and that all the bells in our set ring together in perfect harmony. In addition, the storage cases will also inspected, cleaned and repairs suggested.

The cost of refurbishment for our 3-octave set of handbells is \$1,930 including shipping to and from Malmark. Any repairs needed to the cases will be an additional expense.

We'd like to have the handbells refurbished over the summer when our choir takes a break. You can help contribute to their refurbishment by donating to the Handbell Choir Fund.

Building Update

- The total cost of construction came in a bit lower than expected. As of May 21st, the construction project calendar is still on schedule.
- Through the use of tax-exempt bonds, we have secured interest rates lower than traditional financing methods.
- The Church Council has approved adding the locker room remodel and commons air conditioning to the first phase of the expansion. Even with these improvements, the expected cost of the project will still be approximately \$300,000 less than the amount originally approved by the voters in November 2017.
- All gym equipment which is not transferable to our new gym has been put up for sale. To date, the bleachers and scoreboard have been sold. Go to craigslist to bid on lockers, backboards, stage lights, etc.
- Volunteer work days have been held to gut classrooms and locker rooms. Thanks to all who donated their time and talents!
- The next major work day will be Saturday, June 23rd at 8 a.m. to remove all the playground equipment.
- Mount Olive has received a tremendous outpouring of gifts for Forward in Faith. (\$1,499,623 as of May 14, 2018). Please continue to offer your regular and sacrificial gifts of love. Your dollars are making a difference!

Bargain Garden's 26th Anniversary

April, 1, 2018, marked the 26th anniversary of The Bargain Garden Thrift Shop (BG). A gift of \$26,000 was given to the FVL designated for *Let the Children Come* as well as an additional one year commitment of \$1,000 monthly for the building fund.

Since its beginning, the BG has donated over \$937,000 to FVL and \$94,000 to other WELS charities. (In 2017 alone, FVL received more than \$80,000.)

More volunteers from our Federation churches are needed. In order for the store to continue its support of FVL's teen ministry into the future, it is vital that our volunteer numbers increase. - Growing in Grace gifts are erasing that mortgage debt as we prepare for our June Mortgage Burning.
- The FVL Legacy Project has helped the FVL Endowment move over the \$4M mark in assets.
- SCRIP Sales for April were \$171K, bringing total sales to date to \$2M.

- April offerings were \$34,352 lower than budgeted.
- Tuition was \$9,765 lower than budgeted.
- Other income was \$12,484 lower than budgeted.
- Total income was \$56,600 lower than budgeted.


