"I know that guy. He sits in front of me every Sunday, but I have no idea what his name is. I could introduce myself and ask his name, but that would be awkward. What would I say? It's probably safest to just keep saying, "Hi."

Has that thought ever crossed your mind while you sat in church? Or, in the cereal aisle at the grocery store? Or, at a local restaurant? It's one of the challenges of being a member of a big church with 1,700 members and four services. How can you possibly know everyone?

The reality is, you can't. You'll never become best friends with everyone at church, or even remember everyone's name. But does that become an excuse that prevents us from trying to get to know anyone else we don't already know?

There's a level of "safety" in sitting in the same pew at the same service and talking to your same group of friends in the atrium after the service is over. It's comfortable. But is that the best practice for God's Kingdom?

When a first-time worship visitor attends church, if they stand solo in the atrium because no one approaches them, do you think they'll come back? When a new member joins, but never connects with anyone, will she eventually go looking for a different church that feels more like home?

If "We're a big church. It's just how things are here." becomes an excuse to never challenge ourselves to break away from our comfort zone of familiar friends to know other brothers and sisters in Christ, it can hinder our ability to reach out with the Gospel.

It's awkward get it. and uncomfortable sometimes. but imagine a church that works hard to get to know each other; to bring new people into the group, and make them feel welcome. Picture the relationships that could bloom exponentially just by taking the time to get to know someone else. It would probably look something like this: "All the believers were together and had everything in common. Every dav continued to meet together in the temple courts. They broke bread in their homes and ate together with glad and sincere hearts, praising God and enjoying the favor of all the people. And the Lord added to their number daily those who were being saved" (See Acts 2:42-47.)

Our New Pastor





New Sunday School Format

A few weeks ago I was sitting with my little nephew on my knee. We had spent a morning playing with blocks and reading, when he asked me a question about Jesus.

To be honest, I don't even recall what his question was, but I

do remember that after that question he wanted all our games, books, and songs to be about Jesus. Doesn't it just humble you and take your breath away when children put their child-like faith on display in their daily lives?

That's the goal of our new Sunday school curriculum called *Cross Explorations*. It's a Bible learning experience designed to teach kids and their parents the same Bible story in age-appropriate ways so that families can grow together in faith. Our new look Sunday school will kick off at 9:15 a.m. on Sunday, September 16th.

Some of the handiest tools available in this new setting are the "Explore More" cards, designed to help students apply the story all week long. They make for great family devotions!

He wrote, "The opportunity to start and do mission work in Bacoor City was presented to us by a Lutheran couple from Appleton, Wisconsin. Gemma is a Filipino whose younger brother and his family lives in Bacoor City..." Gemma is a member at St. John Lutheran in Appleton (Mackville).

Here is an update: "The work in

Bacoor City, Cavite, is still going on. We are now a few lessons away from completing the Catechism study of those attending our Saturday morning bible class (4 adults). The game plan is that after these 4 adults have completed their Catechism study, we will start opening up our activities to the people in the community in order that our work in the area will expand."

The travel time from Law and Gospel Lutheran Church, in Quezon City, is about two hours without heavy traffic. Thankfully, God has provided another helper with some Lutheran seminary training, Mr. Ed Pigon. God willing, Mr. Pigon will be able to assist in reaching this new community!

Presently our mission partner, Law and Gospel Lutheran Church, consists of 9 communicants, 60 souls, and 17 active prospects. It is our privilege to "walk together" with this infant congregation as they share the pure Gospel of Jesus and encourage them with prayers, hymnal, school supplies, and financial gifts. Thank you!



Handbell Refurbishment

Thank you to everyone who has generously donated toward the Handbell Refurbishment! The bells were shipped to Malmark in early June.

During the refurbishment process each disassembled. bell was inspected, polished, and parts were repaired or replaced as needed. Six handles needed to be replaced, the cost of which was covered by warranty. After reassembly. each bell individually re-tuned to make sure its sound is of the highest quality. Then the entire set of bells was rung together to make sure the tonal qualities blend to ring in perfect harmony. Unfortunately, two of the "C" bells did not match the rest of the set and required new castings, which is not covered under warranty. Finally, the storage cases were also inspected and cleaned. One of the cases needed its lining replaced to avoid damage to the bells. Case repair is not covered by warranty either.

The new castings and case lining added about \$330 to the original \$1,315 refurbishment cost. Currently, the Handbell Choir Fund has received \$812 toward refurbishment. Please consider helping cover the rest of the cost by donating to the Handbell Choir Fund. Thank you!



- Praise the Lord and thanks to all the volunteers and workers who made it possible to open the 2018-19 school year on time! Student orientation begins on August 20 and the first day of school is August 22.
- Enrollment for year looks to be in the range of 660. More information will be shared on the exact numbers in our September report. This will be the largest enrollment ever on this campus!
- One hundred seventy-two students have received vouchers through the Wisconsin Parental Choice Program. What a blessing for our families to be a part of this program!
- Repair work has begun on our vandalized soccer and football fields. Because of DNR permitting issues only one field can be done at a time. The high cost of the field repairs (\$250K) is because the fields need to be totally redone due to the extent of the damage and our need to protect players from injury.
- FVL is hosting its annual Pastor and Staff Minister Day on Friday, September 14.
- So that grandparents can see the new building expansion, FVL will be hosting Grandparents' Days on Thursday and Friday, October 4-5. Normally these days are only held every other year. Registration information will be shared in mid-September.
- A special Dedication Service for the *Let the Children Come* expansion is set for 2:00 p.m. on Sunday, October 14. Our guest speaker will be WELS Northern Wisconsin District President Rev. Joel Zank. An open house is planned following the service.

A \$10,000 reward is still being offered for information that would enable police to make an arrest in this case.
- FVL Theatre's fall play will be *The Election*. Public performance dates will be October 18 (7 p.m.); October 20 (4 p.m.); and October 22 (2 p.m.) Watch for ticket info in mid-September.

FINANCIAL UPDATE

- Congregational offerings for operations totaled \$136,605 for June and \$928,899 for the year. The commitment was \$970,400. Offerings this July are behind last year, with collections of \$20,212.
- Let the Children Come contributions and pledges to be received by September 1 totaled \$590K as of August 10. A total of \$1M is needed by September 1 to take advantage of low interest rates through tax exempt bonds.
- Scrip sales for July were \$170K. Tuition assistance to families will be \$67K. Total sales since 2003 is now close to \$36M.




