God's Grace through Gleason: The Story Continued

In mid-February, I preached a sermon about the importance of Evangelism—sharing the good news of Jesus with others—and the impact that that can have on people's lives and eternity. To conclude the sermon, I shared a family story about a very important man in my life whose name was Gleason.

Gleason worked for an electrical company. On nice days, he'd take his lunch across the street and eat it under a big shade tree. That tree was in the front yard at my maternal grandparents' house. At that time, my grandparents, my mother—who was four—and her siblings didn't have faith that Jesus was their Savior.

But Gleason shared his faith with them. And the Holy Spirit went to work to create faith in their hearts through the gospel. What an impact Gleason's evangelism had on my family's lives and eternity!

My mom (as moms do) shared that sermon video with Gleason's daughter, Claudia. After she'd watched it, Claudia told my mom that there was "more to the story" that makes it even more continued

amazing. I want to share the rest of the story with you because it really does highlight God's perfect plans and the eternal impacts of sharing the gospel.

In 1918, Gleason's parents were married. A year later, his older brother Darwin was born. Two years after that, Gleason's mother found out that she was pregnant again. However, Gleason's father wasn't all that happy with having one child, and he certainly didn't want two. So he told his wife, "When the second baby is born, we're going to just let it die." Terrified of what her husband would do if she disobeyed him, Gleason's mother started plotting how she would save her baby.

Nine months later, she kept it secret that she was going into labor until her husband left for work. Then, with the help of a neighbor, who could also serve as a witness that the baby was born alive, she delivered the baby. Obviously, when her husband found out he was furious.

Fearful what her husband might do to her and her children, she left him, took the boys, and set out on her own. Needing to find a job to support her and her family, she put the two boys into foster care and found work. During that time, she caught the eye of a young man who regularly walked past the house where she was living. They struck up a friendship and began courting.

At that time, Gleason's mother didn't know about Jesus. And so,

Harold, the man she was dating, started sharing his faith with her. The Spirit worked and brought her to faith through the gospel. Finally, in 1924, they were married. Harold adopted the two boys, had them baptized, and raised them in the faith like they were his own biological sons. The man who first shared his faith with my maternal grandparents and my mother, almost never lived. And, he almost never had the faith that he shared with my family. But then a man shared his faith, and God did the rest!

It's a truly amazing story of God's grace. Maybe your story looks a little different, but each story is no less miraculous. That God would call unbelieving sinners, destined for hell into his love; making them members of his holy family through faith and the Spirit's work in the gospel!

And now, God gives you the opportunity and the wonderful purpose of sharing the good news of Jesus and your faith story. As the Apostle Peter wrote, "You are a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, and people belonging to God, that you may declare the praises of him who called you out of darkness into his wonderful light" (1 Peter 2:9).

What a calling! What grace, that God has called you into his light—and then called you to share the light with others in darkness!





Financial Update



March 2019

Review of February's financials:

- February offerings were \$9,573 **lower** than budgeted.
- Tuition was \$4,658 **higher** than budgeted.
- Other income was \$22,856 **lower** than budgeted.
- Total income was \$27,770 **lower** than budgeted.
- Total expenses, before FVL/ Synod distributions, were \$292 **higher** than budgeted.
- The net (loss) for February, including FVL/Synod distributions of \$28,764 was -\$39,218. This compares to a budgeted loss of -\$11,156.

Year-to-date financial results are as follows:

- Offerings are \$700 under budget.
- Tuition is \$18,557 **over** budget.
- Total income is \$2,877 **under** budget.
- Total expenses are \$4,751 **under** budget.
- The actual net income YTD is \$(64,702), which is \$1,874 **favorable** compared to the budget.
